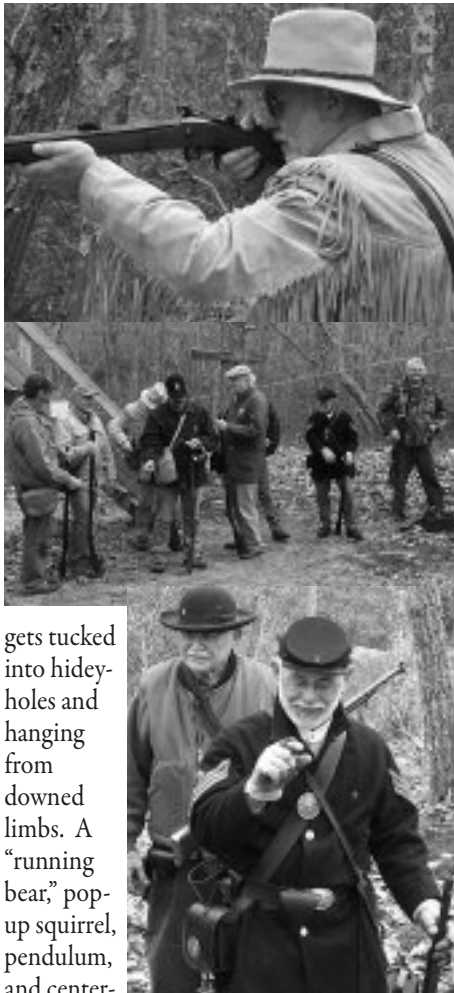

## Members Approve Moderate Dues Increase And Big Annual Raffles for Capital Strength

Members at the well-attended March 14 monthly meeting voted to approve annual cost-of-living dues increases, plus the creation of an annual raffle program which would feature substantial prizes and mandatory ticket sales. The dues-and-raffle program is part of a more general "enhancement" designed to keep the club in the black – and flexible financially. The club's electric bills will soon be reduced with an investment in energy-saving fixtures and lamps, based on a recent professional survey. A new system for recording and rewarding work hours will be instituted with "Club Bucks" that are redeemable at any NSC function, including the Lounge and meals. Details will be submitted in the coming months by a committee working under the club's executive board.

## Big Boars Fall to NSC Hunters

A full day's hunt in Aurora, Maine – just about 30 miles north of Bangor – landed two hunters some 580 pounds of Russian Boar. The hunters were NSC's Brad Wolff of Ivoryton and



his buddy Dan Vautrain of West Springfield, Mass. (Dan's a familiar face at the club and filled up happily at our recent game dinner.) The March 14-16 trip (a day up, a day in the tree stands, a day back) was hosted at the Hillside Game Ranch, where owner Scott Beede owns 888 acres of dense woodland.

A club member for five years and the proud "meat man" in Tony Cutone's Sunday kitchen crew, Brad reports that "It's a real nice place with terrific food – the lodge sleeps 20 people. This was my third trip up there in six years. You can shoot out of tree stands, or use guides and Australian shepherd dogs.

"My pig weighed in at 300 pounds; Dan's pig weighed in at 280 pounds. Mine had a solid 1 1/2 inches of fat, pretty much everywhere except on the legs, and netted 190 pounds of meat."

Hillside bills itself as "the largest game ranch in New England" and is open 365 days a year. It offers big-game hunts for exotics such as russian boar, red stag, fallow, elk, and buffalo. All game ranch hunts include two days hunting, the animal, home-cooked meals in a modern lodge, transportation, and guide service. ## Profile: Jay Cole ...one of a series on club mainstays over the years

John Cole – known to NSC folk as Jay – is familiar to us as the coordinator of the club's active Youth program, as a competitive pistol shooter in the New London County league, and as an avid blackpowder and high-power rifle shooter. In his other life, the Westbrook resident also heads the technology-education program at Morgan High School in Clinton, and keeps his students' alert with a wide variety of shop tools and building principles. Need to weld? Use a power saw? He's there. Need to drive a nail...without bending it? He's there too. Now, how about drawing up those plans and doing the math accurately? Sure!

Jay's teaching skills come to the fore with the NSC Juniors. The program stresses safety as the kids learn basic marksmanship, and then extends into the woods and fields with map reading, plant and animal identification, and orienteering. On the water, the kids learn to fish and tie flies. Jay participated in a club youth program very similar to NSC's when he was young, and also shot the NRA qualification program.

Jay's wife, Debbie, is also a competitive Bullseye match shooter (but discretion forbids mentioning who scores best at many matches). Their two children, Jake and Jessica, are attending West Virginia University, Jay's alma mater. Both the kids graduated from the NSC program. The Mountaineers also have one of the best smallbore rifle teams in the U.S., Jay notes...he fired with the team as an undergraduate, when he was a forestry student focusing on the wood-products industry, where he worked before teaching.

Jay likes to walk the land, especially in the Catskill Mountains of New York near Roscoe, and to fish there in the Beaverkill. His grandfather's cabin is now, with Jessica and Jake, into its fourth generation.

Jay believes that youth are the future of the traditional outdoor sports...and is doing his best at creating the new generation of responsible outdoorsmen and outdoorswomen. He's an NRA-certified instructor in rifle, pistol, muzzleloader, and a range safety officer.

"As coordinator of the NSC youth pro-

gram," Jay reflects, "I have had the good fortune to meet and work with great people of all ages sharing similar interests. There is always a give-and-take interaction, a spirit of fun and seriousness.

"I am constantly impressed with the support and generosity of the membership."

## Date Set for Pistol

### All-Star Match

The New London County Pistol League, the Metropolitan Revolver League of Hartford, the Bridgeport Rifle Club Winter Pistol League, the Revolver League of Connecticut of New Haven, and the Southwest Pistol League of Fairfield will vie for state honors at a one-day Interleague All-Star Pistol Match on Sunday, March 30.

The 90-shot, 900-point match will be hosted by the Metropolitan League at the Metropolitan Shooters Inc. competition range in Manchester. Some 70 competitors will vie for statewide league and individual honors in the nationally standardized "bullseye" format. The Metropolitan league edged out both the league challengers at matches in the past three years, but the margins have been growing closer.
